The above are from the book I am reading, Shift. And I welcome comments and reactions to the phrases, particularly since we are in a stage of looking at our language. Each month we look at our Spending Plan for Ministry, which was developed at the beginning of the year. Also, later this summer, Mutual Ministry Team will meet to have a yearly congregational review instead of pastoral evaluation/review. Leadership and congregational members will discuss how the past year has been, where we are now and the upcoming year. In the vein of language, I believe it is important to keep in front of us our assets, so let me close with moments of celebration:

- We are people who serve, God, others and ourselves. While it can be very easy to look at other communities and want to be 'like them' let's celebrate who we are:
- New windows have been installed & are fully paid for. WE DID NOT HAVE TO GO INTO DEBT to pay for the windows!
- We had a successful evening VBS here at NGMLC. Three staff from Sugar Creek Camp were here Sunday Thursday, and each afternoon and evening they gathered with children to sing songs, play games and learn about God. This is the first year an evening VBS was

attempted, and it served youth in the community!!

- Another person who visited our church commented on the <u>beautiful view</u> and the desire to simply sit in the sanctuary and stare outside.

Electronic Giving

Summer is upon us; evidence of the hot and muggy days we have had. Traditionally, summer time is when families and people take extended weekends to travel. Summertime is filled with graduation parties, weddings and family reunions, which means travel and oftentimes being away from home. While it is easy to draw on the old saying, that the mortgage and utilities and salaries still need to be paid during the summer (this is true), as a community of faith remembering why we are present, we remember that ministries continue to happen during the summer. We have weekly worship. Preparations for fall programming occurs. Summer VBS happens here. Monthly communion service occurs at Artisan and Parkside, local assisted living homes.

Personally Scott and I utilize the Simply Giving program, and have been doing so for years. It allows us to ensure our offering is given. It also allows us to not have to remember each week, or play catch up.

Update on staff hiring

At the time of this writing, positions have been posted with mixed response. Interview teams are reviewing applications for the office manager and high school youth coordinator positions. The music director and elementary youth education coordinator positions are being reposted, and the application deadline has been extended until July 10th. Many people have wondered how the middle school age youth will be served, and to that there are two answers. Leadership is happy to say that Johnna Georgia will be serving as Kings Kids Youth Coordinator. Her experience and passion for youth has been evident in the strong relationships she has formed here at NGMLC with parents and youth. Her responsibilities will be drastically different, which is why we split the one youth coordinator position into three positions. Johnna is a deacon in the ELCA *see below for more information on deacons * and as such will draw on her theological education as she works with Kings Kids leading worship once a month on Wednesday evenings.

ELCA Deacons

 Ministers of Word and Service. Deacons serve in congregations and other ministries of the ELCA, including family ministries, youth, administration, volunteer ministry, social services, music or parish nursing. Deacons connect the church with the needs of the world and work to equip others to lead a living, active and caring Christian life.

Every rostered minister goes through theological training and a candidacy process. The candidacy process raises up, prepares, certifies and places public leaders in the ELCA. Family, friends, congregations, ministry organizations, synods, seminaries and staff from the church wide organization all play important roles in this process. ~ www.elca.org

At the 2016 ELCA Church Wide Assembly changes were made to the three rosters of lay leaders. As of January 1, 2017, those who have served on the lay rosters as associates in ministry, diaconal ministers and deaconesses are now part of one unified roster of 'Ministers of Word and Service,' and are called deacons. ~ Carol Schickel, Deacon

Madison Jail Ministry

Did you know that area Lutheran churches have had a presence in the Madison Area Jails for over 50 years? In 1970, Madison Area Lutheran Council (MALC) was established to provide ministry and support for people who are incarcerated. In mid-2016, the MALC executive committee voted to change the name to Madison Area Jail Ministry (MAJM). Over the course of 50 years, the Jail Ministry grew in scope and size. When MALC was formed, a part time volunteer chaplain served a population of approximately 100 men and women. Today, two paid chaplains (one part-time and one-full time), a Secretary, and a Volunteer Coordinator serve the 800+ people who are incarcerated each day in Dane County Jail.

The Advisory board is comprised of numerous Christian denominations, United Church of Christ (UCC), Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA), Lutheran Church- Missouri Synod (LCMS), Presbyterian, United Methodist, Episcopal, Moravian and Reformed.



While I serve on the Executive Committee as a voting member of the board, this ministry would not exist if people didn't come forward and give of their time and resources. Only because people have served in this ministry are people who are incarcerated able to participate in bible studies, addiction recovery programs, life-skills training and literacy tutoring. HEARTS FOR HAZEL - Change Ministry for July

Here is some background information on Hazel:

Hazel is 7 and will be turning 8 on August 27 (born in 2009). She lives with her Dad Last, Mom Yeukai, and twin sisters Hayley and Hadley. They will be turning 3 on July 13 (born in 2014).

The Maseya Family are Legal Immigrants from Zimbabwe. They moved to South Africa when Hazel was 18 months old to try and find work and improve their living situation.

Last is a Pastry Chef and also a Taxi Driver. Yeukai does sewing and needlework to help bring in income. She also cleans houses when she has the chance.

Starting about 2 years ago, Immigrants to South Africa have been targeted with job loss, housing loss, muggings and killings. It has been a difficult time for Maseya Family. Last has lost his job and their housing multiple times, and severe hunger is an ongoing issue for the family.

Hazel was 3 when NGMLC started sending her to an English Speaking Preschool. In order to get her into an English Speaking Grade School she had to have the preschool background. She is currently in her 2nd year of Elementary School.

Since we started helping Hazel we have sent money for a number of school related items and food (Hazel had been going to school with her lunch pail empty. As we all know, it is hard to learn when you are hungry.)

The goal for NGMLC is to continue to help Hazel get her education. The family will all benefit from Hazel's Education as she will be able to rise out of poverty and support her family in the future.
